SHOWING REGULATIONS

- 1. Exhibitor** - You will need to provide the Ashby de la Zouch & District Agricultural Society with certain personal information relating to you. Your privacy is extremely important to us and so we want you to know exactly how we will use that personal information. Our full privacy notice setting out detailed information about matters such as personal information we use, for what purpose we use it, what our legal basis for doing so is and who we share it with can be viewed on our website www.ashbysshow.com. The booking of your class entry to this show will show you agree to this notice.
- 2. Ownership** - All classes in this schedule are open to exhibitors residing in any part of the United Kingdom. Exhibits in all classes must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor and must be in their ownership at the date of the Show. The exhibitor's name(s) on the Show entry form must be the same as on the animal registration certificate. In the event of the death of an exhibitor between the date of entry and the date of the Show, the executors of the deceased will be deemed to be the exhibitor.
- 3. Entries - ENTRIES FOR ALL CLASSES - £15** (unless otherwise stated). LIHS Classes are £28 (£10 to LIHS) Due to current legislation, **ALL** entries must be made on-line. All entries and fees must be received by the closing date for entries. The entry fee for any animal entered but not exhibited will be forfeited (except as provided for under British Showjumping Rules). Unaccompanied Competitors must provide the Show Organiser a contact telephone number in case of an emergency. An additional Administration Charge of £25 will be made in the event of unpaid entries.
The official entry closing date is 18 th June 2024 and any entry RECEIVED after this date will be considered late.
LATE ENTRIES: Late entries may be **accepted** but a late entry fee of **£10** will be added to the entry fee.
- 4. Nominations of Entries** - The name of the exhibit and all relevant details must be stated on the entry form, except in the case of Showjumping and Side-Saddle classes. **NO SUBSTITUTION OF ENTRIES WILL BE ALLOWED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES.**
- 5. Cancellation of Classes** - The Society reserves the right to amalgamate or cancel classes or sections in the event of there being insufficient entries. Entry fees for classes cancelled by the Society will be refunded.
- 6. Admission - No TICKETS OR PASSES WILL BE ISSUED TO HORSE EXHIBITORS.** Please print out your confirmation email of your booking and display in the front of your vehicle to allow admittance into the horse lorry park, using the **RED ENTRANCE**. (Follow the **RED HORSE SIGNS**).

A relevant number of wristbands will be allocated for you to pick up with your back numbers, for admittance to the main show ground. Vehicles other than ones carrying horses must park in the public parking areas and anyone not holding passes will be charged normal prices at the gate. **NO CARS WILL BE ALLOWED TO PARK IN THE HORSE BOX FIELD.**

Extra persons will be expected to pay for admission and Stewards may inspect vehicles. **All exhibitors should be on the Show ground at least half an hour before the stated judging time for their respective classes. EXHIBITORS ARE RECOMMENDED TO ARRIVE EARLIER TO AVOID TRAFFIC CONGESTION AT THE ENTRANCE GATES.** EXHIBITORS SHOULD ENSURE THAT THEY BRING ALL THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTATION TO THE SHOW, AS REQUIRED BY MINISTRY REGULATIONS. FAILURE TO DO SO MAY RESULT IN ANIMALS BEING REFUSED ADMISSION TO THE SHOW GROUND.

7. Veterinary - The Society's veterinary surgeons are authorised to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to the Show ground suspected of being infected with a contagious or infectious disease or with a disease or injury which, in their opinion renders it unfit or unsafe to be exhibited. Such an animal will not be allowed to compete. The exhibitor will be held entirely responsible by the Society for any circumstances which may result from the appearance of such an animal on the Show ground. The Society reserves the right to take blood samples from any animal which the Judge and/or Stewards suspect may have been dosed with illegal substances. A horse ambulance will be in attendance.

8. Equine Influenza - Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21 – 92 days later), followed by the first booster (150 – 215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose. Horses must have been vaccinated within 12 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show. Foals

In-foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born. Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course.

PLEASE NOTE THAT NEITHER VACCINATION CERTIFICATES NOR PASSPORTS SHOULD BE SENT TO THE HOW OFFICE PRIOR TO THE EVENT. HOWEVER, CHECKS WILL BE CARRIED OUT ON THE SHOW GROUND DURING THE SHOW

It is strongly recommended that all horses and ponies should be vaccinated against Equine Influenza. The Society's Veterinary Surgeons will inspect the horse lines. Stewards, at the direction of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons, are empowered to require any horse or pony showing clinical signs of equine influenza to be immediately removed from the Show ground. In the event of a serious outbreak the Society reserves the right to require vaccination certificates to be produced

9. Identification - Exhibits shall be identified in the Judging Rings solely by the numbers issued by the Secretary, corresponding to the catalogue entry for the exhibit.

10. Judging - The Society reserves the right to appoint a substitute should any judge be prevented from attending the Show and all entries are accepted on this understanding. Times of judging, as stated in this Schedule, will be adhered to as strictly as possible but are subject to alteration. Exhibitors must be ready to enter the ring when called upon by the Stewards. A public address system will be used to advise horse and pony competitors to be ready, but it is **SOLELY THE COMPETITORS RESPONSIBILITY** to be in the ring in time for their class. The Judges and Stewards have discretion to withhold or vary the first and any other prizes should the quality of the entry or entries not merit such a prize.

11. Horse Height - Where the height of the horse or pony is specified in any class, the Judge or Steward may require such animals entered in the class to be measured, unless the animal has an official measurement certificate, issued by the Joint Measurement Scheme. Half an inch will be allowed for normal shoes.

12. Age - The date of birth should be stated on the entry form for foals. The year of birth only need be stated for horses and ponies. All winners of children's classes will be expected to produce birth certificates, if necessary. Riders aged 18 years and under on the day of the Show, must state their date of birth on the entry form.

13. Safety - Anyone RIDING a horse or pony anywhere on the Show ground or LEADING a horse or pony on the Horse Walk, in the Collecting Rings or in the Show Rings, must be wearing a hat, approved by the governing body of the association under whom they are exhibiting if so required by that governing body or association. All competitors in the jumping phase of the Working Hunter classes must wear correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards: ALL PAS015, VG1, EN 1384 2023,, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023. SNELL E2016 and E2021, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards. Hats which bear EN1384 or BSEN 1384 ALONG WITH another accepted standard, will be permitted. For example, BSEN1384, PAS015

(1998 or 2011) along with the Kitemark or Inspec IC mark will be acceptable, but not BSEN1384 on its own. All riders in BSPS classes are required to adhere to rule 43 in the 2024 BSPS rule book with regard to hat specifications and tagging. The attention of all exhibitors is drawn to the Society's Policy, a copy of which may be seen at the Secretary's marquee. All animals must be secured by halter or other means, except as required at the time of judging. Unruly and fractious animals may be refused admission to the judging rings by the Stewards. Exercising of horses and ponies will only be allowed in the designated exercise areas.

14. Conduct - The Council may at any time, before or during the Show, reject any entry, whether the same has been accepted or not, without giving reasons and their decision shall be final. The Council also has the power to eject from the Show ground any commercial photographers, or persons whose behaviour they consider to be objectionable. All dogs on the Show ground must be always kept on leads.

15. Dress - Exhibitors of horses and ponies, grooms and attendants must wear correct dress, as approved by the governing body under whose rules they are exhibiting.

16. Objections - Any exhibitor wishing to lodge an objection must do so in writing and must deliver it to the Secretary within an hour of the Judge's decision being given. Such objections must be accompanied by a deposit of £10 and will be considered by the Council and their decision shall be final. The deposit will be returned if the objection is sustained. Any complaints should be passed to the Chief Horse Steward to deal with.

17. Prize Money:

1st £20. 2nd £15. 3rd £10. - Following the judge's decision in each class and special award, winning exhibitors will be handed vouchers for their prize money. Prize money will be paid by transfer after the show. Please note that all prize money cards not handed in on the day will be forfeited.

18. Trophies - All trophies will be available for collection at the Horse Field marquee after each section has finished. They will be held by the winner for one year but will remain the property of the Society and must be returned as directed by the Secretary.

19. Missed Class - IT IS THE COMPETITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARRIVE AT THE START OF THEIR CLASSES ON TIME. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN IF CLASSES ARE MISSED.

20. Responsibility - The Society, its Officers and Staff, disclaim any responsibility and all liability in respect of any accident, damage, injury, disease or loss, howsoever caused, that may occur to any exhibitor or his servant, or the public, or to any animal, article, vehicle or property brought on to the Show ground, or while entering or leaving the Show ground. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by or arising from any animal, article, vehicle or property, exhibited or brought on to the Show ground by him. He shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of, or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned.

21. Other Regulations - Any person, competing or exhibiting an animal in a class covered by a breed society, shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of that breed society and be subject to its constitution and rules (including any disciplinary procedures) insofar as they are applicable to the Show. This Schedule is issued subject to the orders (if any) of DEFRA and local authorities, which may be applicable at the date of the Show.

22. Interpretation - Anything not provided for in the foregoing shall be decided by the Society's Council, whose decision shall be final and binding. On the day of the Show, the Chairman shall have all the powers of the Council under these regulations.

23. Any competitor deemed to be **Rude** or **Aggressive** towards Judges, stewards or volunteers of the Ashby show society will be asked to leave the show ground.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Frank Hewitt Hunter Champion of Champion Cup. The Champion & Reserve Champion from the Ridden Hunter and Ridden Working Hunter are all eligible to compete for this Championship.

The Rotherwood Supreme In-Hand Trophy. The Champion & Reserve Champion from the M & M In-Hand, Welsh Section A & B C & D, Shetland (Overall), Pony Breeding and highest placed In-hand Coloured 15h or under are all eligible for this Championship.

Supreme Ridden Pony Championship. The Champion & Reserve Champion from the M&M Ridden, Mini M&M, Open Show Hunter Pony, Mini Show Hunter Pony, Local Rider, WHP & Mini WHP are all eligible for this Championship.

QUALIFIERS

- Q1. This Show is a qualifier for the **NCPA Pony of the Year Show** at Warren Farm, Formby, L37 8DJ, in September 2024 1st and 2nd prizewinners in appropriate classes will qualify.
- Q2. **NPS Blackerton and Sharptor Stud M&M In-Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championships.** These classes will be judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a Member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for the Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championships to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show on 2 – 4 August 2024
- Q3. **BSPS ROGER'S TRUCK SERVICE S LTD CHALLENGE.** Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Show Pony, SHP, WHP, Cradle & Nursery Stakes, Int SRT, SH, WH and Heritage M&M Lead Rein, First Ridden and WHP. This show is a qualifier for the BSPS Challenge. Animals must qualify for the Challenge by attending any BSPS affiliated Show and competing in the appropriate class. Ponies must NOT have qualified for the 2024 HORSE OF THE YEAR SHOW in the appropriate class.
- Q4. **BSPS BINKS FAMILY CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS** - This show is a qualifier for the BSPS Binks Family Champion of Champions, 1st prize winners in the following classes will qualify. Open lead rein, first ridden, lead rein of hunter type, show pony, SHP, WHP, Intermediate SH, SRT and WH. Heritage open lead rein, first ridden, ridden and WHP.
- Q5. **BSPS BINKS FAMILY CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS** – This show is a qualifier for the BSPS Binks Family Mini WHP Champion of Champions, 1st prize winners in open cradle and nursery stakes will qualify.
- Q6. This Show is affiliated to **EQUIFEST**, taking place at the Arena UK on 1st – 4th August 2024. The two highest placed exhibits, not already qualified, in each affiliated class will qualify.
- Q7. This Show is a qualifier for **The National Welsh Championship Show – 11TH August 2024** at Three Counties Show ground, Malvern. See Sections relevant to registered Welsh breeds (in hand & Ridden for qualifications details. Qualifiers will be directly contacted after this show with details of qualification and entry details. For Show Details and Schedule see our **Facebook page or nationalwelshshow.co.uk**.
- Q8. This Show is a qualifier for **The Dodson & Horrell Equine Sports UK Championships (ESUK)**, taking place at Arena UK, Grantham, on 25th – 27th July 2024. The three highest placed exhibits will qualify in each class.
- Q9. **LONDON INTERNATIONAL QUALIFIERS DECEMBER 2024.**

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 148cm. Plaited ponies. Riders not to have attained their 17th birthday on 1st January in the current year.

CLASS 23 – BSPPS PERFORMANCE PONY

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 158 cm. Plaited Ponies/horses. Riders any age.

CHAMPIONSHIP

The 1st & 2nd prize winners of Classes 21, 22 & 23 are eligible to compete for Champion and Reserve Champion.

QUALIFIER

Classes 21,22 and 23 are qualifiers for the **LONDON INTERNATIONAL SHOW**

Classes 24 & 25 are qualifiers for **The National Welsh Championship Show 2024**

Riders of Lead Rein Show Ponies are not to have attained their 8th birthday. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle, the lead rein to be attached by the noseband only. A first rosette will be given to the highest placed Show Pony.

Q14c The two highest placed exhibits in Class 24, not already qualified, will qualify for the Equifest Show Hunter Pony Lead Rein Championship.

CLASS 26: OPEN SHOW HUNTER / SHOW PONY / RIDING TYPE

Mares or gelding. 4 years old or over. Riders correct age for the pony.

The rider MUST demonstrate the following movements within their display. Walk, trot and canter on both reins, canter transitions must be on a straight and not on a corner, the show must also include a canter circle, an extended canter, not a gallop, a free walk on a long rein on one rein and halt.

The BSPS Performance Coloured Classes are open to mares, geldings and CHAPS (UK) or BSPA. 4 years old and over to be registered in and complying with the showing requirements of the main body of the stud book of the coloured Horse and Pony Society CHAPS(UK) or the British Skewbald and Piebald Association (BSPA). Ponies can be registered with either of these Societies or the BSPS and owners and rider must be or become members within 7 days of the BSPS to take the qualification.

CLASS 27: BSPS PERFORMANCE COLOURED NATIVE/COB/TRADITIONAL HORSE PONY CLASS.

Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over. Riders any age. Unplaited.

CLASS 28: BSPS PERFORMANCE COLOURED NON-NATIVE HORSE / PONY CLASS.

Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over. Riders any age. Plaited.

1st and 2nd Prize Winners from classes 27 and 28 will be eligible for the championship.

LOCAL RIDER

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Open to riders/handlers living within a 20-mile radius of the show ground.

ENTRY FEE: £15.00

CLASS 29 - LOCAL RIDER LEAD-REIN

Mare or Gelding, four years old or over, not exceeding 138cm. Riders 10yrs and under on 1st January of the current year. Rider and pony combinations competing in this class may NOT enter any other Local Rider classes

Class 30 – LOCAL RIDER FIRST RIDDEN

Mare or Gelding, four years old or over, 138cm or under. Riders 12yrs and under on 1st January of the current year. Rider and pony combinations competing in this class may **NOT** enter any other Local Rider classes.

CLASS 31 - LOCAL RIDER - Horses & Ponies - Ridden

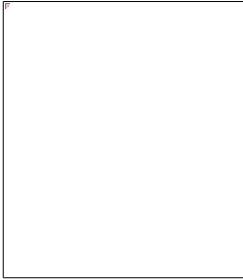

CLASS 113 - RISING STAR of WORKING HUNTER TYPE

Open to Hunters,

Mare or, gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cm. Any horse which is registered / previously as a Grade A Show jumper, advanced Eventer, or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Height of Fences: minimum 3'0", maximum 3'3", maximum spread 3'3"

Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative.

The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Hunter

Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

The first and second prizewinners from Class 112 and 113 are eligible to compete in the Championship. The Champion & Reserve Champion to go forward to the **Frank Hewitt Hunter Champion of Champions**. Ring and time to be announced.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Mare or gelding, 4yrs old or over and of any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2024. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. All entries must be registered with RoR and HAVE raced in GB or been in training in GB. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National

Championships, Aintree August 2024. The judge will not ride. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge. **Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.** All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules & Regulations from time to time in force. The class to be judged 50% jumping, 20% style while jumping and performance and 30% awarded for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

Phase 1

Jumping to be judged:

8 rustic jumps 3' (90 cm) to 3' 3" (1m) with a maximum spread of 95cm) The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

10 points to be deducted for a knock down

15 points to be deducted for a refusal

20 points for second refusal

Elimination for third refusal or fall or error of course

Phase 2

Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. (In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class).

Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1.5 minutes. Show to include the following movements:

Walk, trot, canter, showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop), halt and stand, walk off on a long rein. Total marks out of 30% for show, manners and suitability to be retrained. Fences for the final at Aintree can be up to a maximum of 3' 6" (1.05m)

Criteria

The leader must be 16 years old or over and may only lead one pony in a class.

The reins MUST go directly from the bit to the rider's hand, with no extra aids or attachments to or on the saddle. Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle on the saddle. The lead rein must be affixed to the nose band on which it must remain while the pony is in the ring. Whilst in the ring ponies must always be led by the leader. The leader should lead on the near side with the lead rein in the left hand.

Riders - Hats in accordance with BSPS rules, Tweed jackets, Beige or cream jodhpurs, shirt, tie, boots and gloves. No buttonholes.

Leaders – Country attire, Gentlemen Trilby Hats or caps, Ladies modest hats.

Method of Judging-

Ponies will enter the ring at the walk, they must be trotted altogether at the Judge's discretion. They will be pulled into line and asked to perform individual test around obstacles including jumping a maximum of three small upright fences not exceeding 30cms. No spread fences. Water will not be included. Ponies will not be asked to walk on artificial material eg plastic sheeting during the test. Riders will not be asked to dismount.

Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course. A student or two of canter over the fences will not be penalised.

There will be NO conformation marks. Ponies must be shown unplaited and in accordance with their breed stands.
