The latter stems from a well set on head and neck combined with a good length of shoulder. The movement should be smooth and graceful with a true pointing of the toe. To achieve these qualities the Hack must be extremely well schooled.

Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue and Black) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline. All types of Air Jackets are not allowed.

HATS

Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021, AS/NZS 3838 2006, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Tagging indicates that the hat meets the accepted standards, no check of the fit or condition of the hat is implied. It is considered to be the responsibility of the members/guardians to ensure the hat complies with the current standards and is tagged before they compete. Members/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed.

The Royal International Horse Show, Hickstead, West Sussex RH17 5NU to be held in July 2024. This show is a qualifier for the RIHS. Ponies must be owned, registered and ridden by BSPS members to compete except for classes 73-76 which must be registered with BSPA, Classes 23-24 with AHS and Classes 8 and 59-65 with BSHA.

In BSPS classes the highest placed pony (not already qualified) from the first three ponies placed in each class will qualify. The following classes are qualifiers:

Competitors are not required to join UK Ponies & Horses to compete at the Summer Classic, qualification cards are not handed out in the ring, however results can be verified by the admin office.

BSPA ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW QUALIFIERS

All stallions must be graded with the BSPA and in possession of a BSPA Stallion ID card which must be carried at all times and produced on request. All stallions must wear a BSPA Stallion disc. No rider under 14 may exhibit a stallion in any BSPA class.

BSPA Qualification: 1st place and the next unqualified competitor standing 2nd or 3rd qualify from each class. No competitor may qualify from lower than 3rd place. BSPA Office: 01354 638226. bspashows@gmail.com Skewbald and Piebald horses / ponies only.

Highest placed amateur and highest placed junior in each class qualify for amateur and Junior Supreme Championship finals to be held at BSPA World of Colour Championship Finals. Cards to be shown and qualification card signed.

The British Show Horse Association

RIHS BSHA Qualifying Classes - Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the Association and all Owners, Exhibitors and Riders must be Association Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers to be quoted on entry forms.

Classes (57-63) are qualifiers for The Royal International Horse Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward.

Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain classes at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack and Riding Horse classes at the same show. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

The three highest placed prize winners in all Open Affiliated classes will qualify to compete in the BSHA Classic of the Year Final. The Finals will be held at the BSHA Hunter & National Championship Shows in September 2023. The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each **Open** class and a Championship rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse).
