APPENDIX B TO THE RULES OF HEATHFIELD AGRICULTURAL SHOW RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY IN HORSE CLASSES

In the event of Show cancelation fees will be refunded less 10% to cover administration costs.

- 1. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to insure all property and livestock which is brought on to the Showground and which is his/ her own, or for which he/she is responsible. The Show requires exhibitors to effect Employers' Liability insurance where this is required by statute. The Show also requires exhibitors to effect Public Liability insurance and Products Liability insurance. The Show therefore requires that all exhibitors ensure that they have the appropriate insurance cover for showing purposes.
- 2. All entries must be accompanied by the correct remittance.
- 3. Entries are received on condition that the Show accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or accident etc., which may be sustained to vehicles, horses, persons or any property whatsoever.
- 4. Closing date for entries is 30th April 2024, late entries up to 17th May will be subject to Late Entry Fee of £10.
- 5. The Show reserves the right to combine two or more classes forward on Show Day if insufficient entries.
- 6. The Show reserves the right to disqualify or refuse the entry of any exhibitor for any reason they may deem unfit.
- 7. In line with National Guidelines and Horse Welfare, all animals ridden anywhere on the showground, rings or lorry parks (day or night),must only be ridden by a rider whose size and weight does not compromise the animal's welfare. We are operating under the 20% rider weight guideline where the rider in full riding attire with full tack must be less than 20% of the animal's body weight. This is based on a relatively fit, healthy animal, as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern. Should it be deemed this is NOT the case the Show reserves the right to disqualify the exhibitor.
- 8. Forfeiture of Fees. Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and no refund will be made in any circumstances.
- 9. Objections or any matter involving the judging of a class shall be submitted in writing to the Show Secretary within 60 minutes of the judging of the event being completed, accompanied by a deposit of £25.00, non-returnable, if the objection is overruled. Any objection will be considered by the Show Secretary with two members of the relevant Show Committee.
- 10. Rapping in the collecting ring or anywhere on or in the vicinity of the Showground is strictly prohibited.
- 11. Riders must keep to the Official Exercising Grounds and must use the Horse Walks for access to all rings on the Showground.
- 12. Exhibitors must abide by the rules of the governing body of the association under whom they are exhibiting.
- 13. Anybody RIDING a horse/pony on the Showground or LEADING a horse/pony on the Horse Walk, in the Collecting Ring or in the Show Rings must be wearing a hat approved by the governing body of the association under whom they are exhibiting if so required by that governing body or association. All competitors in the jumping phase of the Working Hunter classes must wear correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the current Safety Standards as set out by the British Horse Society - see link **2022-bhs-approvals-hat-guide-v1.pdf**. Exhibitors must wear a hat if entering the ring, unless the governing body under which the class is being shown stipulates otherwise, when the exhibitor must have signed and returned to the Secretary **prior** to show day a Heathfield Agricultural Show waiver form.
- 14. Exhibitors Admission Tickets and Vehicle Passes: All non-member exhibitors will be supplied with wristbands on a strict scale according to the number of animals entered, plus a vehicle pass. (Members will have their members' badges). It should be noted that all passes are issued for the use of the exhibitor only and are strictly non transferable. Any person (whether owner, servant, driver or rider) not carrying an admission ticket must pay the appropriate charge at the gate. Additional tickets may be purchased on line (at the advanced price).
- 15. Vehicle Parking: To be allowed access to the designated parking area apart from the public car parks, all vehicles must carry an exhibitor's vehicle pass showing the exhibitor's name and telephone number. No vehicle access will be allowed to any other areas of the Showground unless prior arrangements have been made.
- 16. All changes to ring timings, etc., will be on the website prior to show day and displayed on a white board in the collecting rings. If in doubt, please check with the Show Secretary.
- 17. Safety. The organiser's of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organiser's and all the Officials and Stewards. Animals must not be left unattended or left unsupervised when tied up to vehicles on any part of the showground at any time. No wheeled items, prams, pushchairs or mobility aids are allowed in the horse walk, collecting and judging rings, except the approved vehicles in the driving classes or any vehicles approved by the Show.
- 18. The use of mobile phones is not permitted within judging rings.
- 19. VETERINARY: The Heathfield Show Veterinary Officer's decision is final. a) Contagion: Every exhibitor of any animal

which to their knowledge is suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, or which has been in contact with any animal suffering as such, shall pay the Show £50 as compensation and for liquidated damages for each and every animal so sent. In addition, in the event of the Show's Vet certifying that any animal sent for exhibition is in his opinion a possible source of danger, such animal shall be removed with due speed by the Participant, from the Showground, or be otherwise managed as per the Vet's direction with a view to averting the spread of contagion. b) It is a condition of entry that in the event of a serious accident to an animal and on the recommendation of the Show Vet that the animal be euthanized all efforts will be made to contact the animal's owner for consent to euthanize. If the owner cannot be found within a reasonable period of time, a police officer on site will be asked to provide written authority as empowered under the Protection of Animals Act 2006. If emergency veterinary treatment is required at the Show, exhibitors will be responsible for the cost of any medication or drugs used in the treatment of their animals and payment must be made direct to the veterinary officer at the time of treatment. c) Any animal that is receiving veterinary treatment at the time of the Show should not be entered unless the owner has had the animal examined by their own Vet and it is safe for them to enter the Show. However, animals still showing evidence of disease will not be permitted to be shown.

- 20. Vaccination: It is required that all horses and ponies entering the Showground are vaccinated and the exhibitor must be able to produce a vaccination certificate, which undeniably relates to that animal, completed, signed and stamped by a veterinary surgeon, who is not the owner of the animal, stating that it has received 3 primary vaccinations against Equine Influenza, the first two given not less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart with a follow up injection 150-215 days later. In addition a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding twelve months. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding seven days, including the day of the Show. Spot checks will be carried out on Show Day.
- 21. All horses must comply with current legislation. There will be random checks during the Show Day and Horse Passports and/or microchips.
- 22. Once a class has started exhibitors will only be permitted to enter the judging ring with the express permission of the judge.
- 23. Qualifying cards that are required to be signed by the judge must be signed in the ring.
- 24. Exhibitors should carefully read the Rules of the Show and by making an entry to the Show the exhibitor is expressly agreeing to comply with the aforementioned Rules.
- 25. HORSE ENTRIES CLOSE: 30th April 2024. Late entries will be accepted up to 17th MAY 2024 on line only (there will be an additional £10 administration fee per late entry.)

EXHIBITORS MUST HAVE PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE COVER TO BE ABLE TO EXHIBIT HORSES AT THE HEATHFIELD AGRICULTURAL SHOW.

CHAPS IN HAND COLOURED HORSE & PONY CLASSES

Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. In order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and have a valid Qualifier card.

Members should apply to CHAPS (UK) for an appropriate qualifier card.

The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 15th-17th Aug 2024.

Classes 150,151 and 152 are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers. For details please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only skewbalds/piebalds may compete in these classes

All stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK) and must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

1st, 2nd and 3rd placed competitors in classes 150 - 152 will qualify for the **UK Ponies & Horses In-Hand Gold Medal Series** at the UK Ponies & Horses Spring Classic 2025 at Onley Equestrian Centre. Competitors are not required to become members of UK Ponies & Horses to compete at the Spring Classic. Qualification Cards will not be issued in the ring; results can be verified by the Office.

The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified will qualify for the **Equifest Ridden Piebald /Skewbald Final** to be held at Arena UK, Grantham 1st - 4th August 2024.

OPEN PRIVATE DRIVING

Horse Judge Mrs Joanne Hartland, Sussex

All horses and ponies must be four years old or over. The Judge will have the power to transfer an entry which in his opinion is entered in the wrong height section. Hackney show wagons and commercial vehicles are not acceptable. Exercise vehicles and pneumatic tyres are acceptable. A brief description of the vehicle to be included with the entry form. £20 travelling expenses will be awarded to each exhibitor.

The driver must be aged 8 years or over on the first day of the show at which they are to compete. A driver under the age of 18 must be accompanied in the vehicle by a competent and responsible person aged 18 years or over. When in the vehicle grooms, passenger/s and driver must have their feet firmly on the floor of the vehicle or use a suitable fixed footrest. This regulation applies at all times and in all areas on the showground. All driver/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 years must wear a correctly fitted hard hat that meets the latest safety regulations when in a carriage or in attendance to a turnout.

Class 155: Driving: ponies not exceeding 138cms

Open to singles and pairs; any type of vehicle, for ponies not exceeding 138cms

Class 156: Driving: ponies exceeding 138cms

Open to singles and pairs; any type of vehicle, for ponies exceeding 138cms

Class HCH103: Driving Concours D'Elegance

All Competitors from classes 155 and 156 are eligible.

Working Hunter Rules:

Correct showing attire to be worn by all riders (beige jodhpurs, tweed jacket, competition shirt and stock/tie) Body protectors recommended for jumping phase but not compulsory, correct riding boots & hat to standard must be worn. Horses to be shown true to type (eg plaited, hogged or natural state depending on horse type) Horses can wear boots for the jumping phase but to be removed for the show phase, martingales are ok to wear for both phases.

First refusal 15 penalties, second refusal 20 penalties, third refusal elimination, jump knock down 10 penalties, fall of horse or rider elimination. Horses will NOT be ridden by the Judge. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the Judge and time permitting. An individual show may be required at the discretion of the Judge.

Best Turned Out Rosette will be awarded in each class - to be decided by the Judge

Class 157: Local Working Hunter over 15hh

Class 158: Local Working Hunter Pony 14hh and under

Qualifier for the **Sunshine Tour Championships**. 1st - 4th place qualify and qualification cannot go down the line. To be held at the All England Showground, Hickstead 12th - 15th September 2024.

Classes are open to rescued horses and ponies from **all Animal Rescue Charities and Organisations**. The Charity/Organisation **MUST** be stated within the story.

Classes are open to all breeds, age and sizes

All entries must provide a brief story of the circumstances of re-homing and the success leading them to be shown in this class. A before and after photo ideally should accompany the story. All stories must be a maximum of 500 words, a maximum of 4 photographs and emailed to horse@heathfieldshow.org. The story will be published through Heathfield Agricultural Show social media pages. By entering this class you hereby give permission for the story to be published.

There will be a maximum number of entries accepted. If the number of entries exceeds the maximum number allowed, there will be a pre-vetting procedure based on the written rescue story that has been submitted at the time of the original entry. Any entries NOT accepted will be informed and have their entry fees refunded in full after the Show.

Horses and ponies will be judged on their show, their performance and their history and rescue journey that will be read out to the public during the competition.

Lead Rein, In-Hand and Ridden are allowed in the class.

Synthetic saddles, Myler bits and nose nets ARE allowed.

Class 160: Rescue Horse or Pony

Best Turned Out Rosette will be awarded by the Judge

HORSE AND HOUND RELAY

Horse Judge Dawn Holmes, East Sussex

This is a fun relay competition with a horse/pony, rider, dog and handler combination. The rider will jump a round of fences no more than 70cms (2'3") then pass the whip/baton over to the handler who will complete a course with the dog.

This will be timed and any penalties will be added to the time as follows:

Knock down - 4 penalties

Refusal - 4 penalties

Wrong Course - 4 penalties

The winner will be the combination with the quickest overall time.

Class 161: Horse and Hound Relay

Horse Judge Dawn Holmes, East Sussex

Mare, Gelding or Stallion 4yrs old and over, riders any age. Horse/ponies need not match, will be asked to do a show of their choice highlighting why they should be considered a pair. Competitors not to have attained the 14th birthday must not ride a stallion or colt.

Turnout of horses and riders will be taken into consideration, conformation will not be taken into account.

Class 162: Pairs - need not match

Best Turned Out will be presented by the Judge

TWO FENCE CHALLENGE

Horse Judge Dawn Holmes, East Sussex

1. To be jumped over a maximum of **five** rounds. There will be two fences, one upright, one **triple bar** with an optional warm-up fence.

2. When the competitor has any faults i.e. a knock down or refusal, they leave the arena. This doesn't include the warmup fence.

Scoring: Jumping fence clear 2 points

Knocking down fence 1 point

Refusal **0 points**

3. The competition finishes either: When all competitors have faulted or at the end of the 5th round.

Winner or winners are those with the most points.

Equal points mean equal placings.

Class 163: TWO FENCE CHALLENGE

Class 164: Tattersalls RoR OPEN Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2024

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2023.

Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavasson noseband. Horses should be plaited. **The first THREE go forward to the championship at Hickstead on June 23rd 2024.** All entries **MUST** be competition registered with the RoR and include their competition registration number on entry form and have **RACED in GB**. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) or will provide 2 ride judges should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly. **Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.**

Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series

RoR Prizes: Rosettes 1st - 4th Vouchers 1st £40, 2nd £30, 3rd £20.

Veteran prize (15+) - £20 voucher to be redeemed from RoR office and qualification for the Veteran Final at the RoR National Championships at Aintree. RoR prizes will not be awarded to RoR qualifiers with numbers forward of two or less, however qualification for the final will stand.

Class 165: Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2024

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur.

Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January of the calendar year holding the classes. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavasson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

The Series is open to AMATEURS only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration.

Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Judge will not ride at the qualifiers but will ride in the final.

Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting, June 23rd 2024.

RoR Prizes: Rosettes 1st - 4th Vouchers 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rule book with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st 2022 Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show.

Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

Class 166: Tattersalls ROR OPEN In Hand Show Series Qualifier 2024

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings.

Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a Bitless/In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored.

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 2024.

RoR Prizes - Rosettes 1st - 4th Vouchers 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10

Class HCH106: Retraining of Racehorses Championship

1st and 2nd placed exhibitors from classes 164, 165 and 166.

THE JO MEW MEMORIAL SHIELD to the Champion.

The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified will qualify for the **Equifest Re-Trained Race Horses Final** to be held at Arena UK, Grantham on 1st - 4th August 2024.

Horse Judge Mrs Jo Strange, Surrey

Class 167: Side Saddle Open Equitation

Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Members' Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. Southernden Farm offers a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. A rosette in memory of The Late Mr R Philpot is offered to the Adult Member and Just So Side Saddle Hire sponsor a rosette for the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out.

THE MERLIN PERPETUAL CHALLENGE TROPHY for the winner.

THE JUNIOR SIDE SADDLE PERPETUAL CHALLENGE TROPHY for the Best Junior Rider

Class 168: Side Saddle Concours D'Elegance

The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse/pony and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance but detailed inspection of the rider or tack is not required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the judge may ask small groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays.

A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Card. N.B. Silk Hats are permitted to be worn by adults IN THIS CLASS AT ANY TIME OF DAY. Juniors must wear hats to current British Safety standards or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk.

THE PJ SKIPS PERPETUAL CHALLENGE TROPHY for the winner.

Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age. Ponies must be 4 years old or over. If a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

Class 208: Junior Riding Competition

CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE

Horse Judge Mr Jamie Sheeny, Kent

Held under the rules of the Concours D'Elegance Society of GB. No Horse/pony registration is required.

All classes are judged on the overall picture of elegance with a strong historical influence.

Hats to BRC current standards must always be worn when mounted by ALL junior riders, with the chinstrap secured. Top hats, bowlers and costume hats may be worn by adult riders and a disclaimer must be signed if you choose not to wear a safety hat.

In Hand classes are performed in walk - a trot in your individual show is optional. Ridden classes are walk and trot in the 'go round'. No cantering is required but may be executed in your individual show. Ladies can execute their show in sitting trot or rising, whichever creates a more elegant picture.

Plumes are not permitted.

The aim is to give a correct presentation for the chosen historical period. Concours D'Elegance is a costume competition, not fancy dress or 'cosplay'. The picture created should represent history, perhaps depicting a film, painting or period drama. Any historical/traditional period may be portrayed up to the 1950's. Costume, tack, rider and horse/pony, including manners, will be taken into consideration.

Participants enter individually, if an unmounted leader is required, he/she may wear correct costume for the period and their role.

Inspection of the costume and horse tack will take place when the class is lined up. Details such as silhouette, fabric (colour, trimmings, weight and materials) appropriate style and drape will be examined. You may be asked about the inspiration behind the design of your costume. Period make-up may be included to help create •the look'. Appropriate accessories may include jewellery, hairstyle and headwear, bag, belt, footwear etc. Veils are acceptable. No jodhpurs or boots should be visible unless they form part of the costume.

Horse tack: Bits and saddles MUST be safe and fit the horse. Any suitable tack is acceptable and you may wish to use themed tack to enhance your costume. Decorated and embellished browbands are acceptable for any type of horse/pony. The welfare of the horse and safety of the rider is always paramount.

Costumes should be tasteful, traditional and have the wow factor. No flesh should be on show, i.e. no bare arms or cleavage. Concours is meant to replicate wearing your 'Sunday Best'. It is not a competition for sparkle and bling.

In Hand Classes: Competitors should enter the arena on the left rein to enable the judge a clear view of the costume.

The Judge's decision is final.

Order of Judging: Ridden Class first, followed by In Hand Class, then Championship. A break of 15 mins will be incorporated between classes for costume changes. Qualifiers:

CONCOURS (GB). First, second and third placed horses/ponies not already qualified in eligible classes will qualify for the Champion of Britain Title classes to be held at Onley Grounds, Rugby on Sunday 3rd September 2024. If a horse/pony has already qualified, cards may be handed down to 6th place at judge's discretion. Each qualified horse/pony will receive a qualification card in the ring which will enable the owner to enter the Championship Show, provided the owner and rider/handler are, or become registered with the Concours D'Elegance Society within 21 days of the qualifying show.
