HEALTH & SAFETY

The Safety & Security of persons and animals attending this show is of paramount importance to the organisers of this show. Competitors and all those attending the show are reminded of their obligations under Health & Safety legislation to adhere to the safety instructions of stewards and officials at all times and to adhere to written instruction and signs relating to safety, for example; horse walks, and pedestrian areas, for their own safety and the safety of others who may be affected by their acts or omissions to act.

IPS SPRING SHOW RULES

- The IPS Show Committee reserve the right to amalgamate classes with insufficient entry numbers and to change judges to allow for the smooth and efficient running of the show.
- In all classes the judge's decision is final

THE RUNNING AND RING ORDER OF CLASSES MAY BE SUBJECT TO CHANGE ON THE DAY

- Every endeavour has been made to avoid classes clashing, but if an exhibitor finds the times
 of their classes overlap, it is suggested permission be obtained from the stewards to jump
 out of turn in the WHP classes, and give individual shows ridden early in the Show Pony
 classes, then leave the pony with an attendant. The attendant may not ride the pony.
 Classes will not be held up for missing competitors. Exhibitors are reminded to consider
 clashing of either pony or riders before entering.
- Dress Code: Riders in Working Hunter Classes must be correctly dressed whilst walking the course.
- All ponies competing in Working Hunter or performance classes must be declared at the ring entrance 15 mins before the relevant class.
- Lunging will only be permitted in a designated area and IPS Rules and Guidelines will be strictly observed.
- NO CHILD UNDER 16 YEARS OF AGE ON 1.1.24 MAY LEAD A PONY IN ANY IN-HAND OR LEAD
 REIN CLASS WITH THE EXCEPTION OF YOUNG HANDLER CLASSES, AND THOSE CHILDREN 1416 YEARS WHO HAVE GAINED COUNCIL PERMISSION TO EXHIBIT YOUNG STOCK.
- ALL RIDERS (INCLUDING THOSE COMPETING IN RIDDEN BREED CLASSES) MUST WEAR SUITABLE HEADGEAR, CORRECTLY FITTED, AT ALL TIMES WHILST MOUNTED.
- The decision of the Show Committee in all matters pertaining to the show (other than the
 merit of an exhibit) and, in particular, as to the interpretation of Rules, Prize and Class
 Schedule, the acceptance or non-acceptance of entries, the determination of eligibility of an
 exhibit, the conduct of the Show, the action of any exhibitor and the awarding or forfeiture of
 prizes shall be final and conclusive.
- All objections must be lodged with the Secretary on the day concerned. No objection shall be
 accepted or considered by the Show Committee unless lodged at or before this time. The
 objection shall be in writing and accompanied by a fee of €150 which shall be retained if the
 objection is not upheld.
- The Irish Pony Society would like to remind all competitors and/or those planning to attend the Championship Show of the Rules governing the Society. These Rules are contained within the 2020 Rules and Guidelines booklet with some rule book amendments and pictures of suitable bits. They can all be accessed on the Society's website under the Members heading, Rule Book. The IPS Rules concerning welfare or safety will be strictly observed and any person found in breach of these Rules will be liable to 'on the spot' fines. These include the tying of ponies to trailers or horse-boxes for which offence the fine is now €150
- The Show Committee and the Irish Pony Society have a 'zero tolerance' policy regarding bad manners or any form of abuse towards any child, adult, official or animal. Anyone found to have contravened this policy will take no further part in the Show and will be requested to leave the Show Grounds forthwith.
- Dogs must be kept on leads at all times.

ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW QUALIFIERS

This show is affiliated to:

- <u>British Show Pony Society</u> -The highest placed (not already qualified) from the first three ponies placed in each class will qualify)
- British Skewbald & Piebald Association 1st place in each class to qualify.
- <u>British Show Horse Association</u> The highest placed (not already qualified) from the first three horses placed in each class will qualify.
- Sport Horse Breeding (GB) the two highest placed horses in the Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight, Small and Ladies (side saddle) Classes will qualify to enter at the RIHS. No horse lower than second will qualify.
- In the Working Hunter class the three highest placed horses will qualify. No horse lower than third will qualify.
- In the Amateur Section when there are two classes, in the lightweight section, the two highest placed smalls and the two highest placed lightweights will qualify and in the heavyweight section the two highest placed middleweights and the two highest placed heavyweights will qualify. Judges must place all horses to determine qualifiers.
- Animals in ridden height restricted classes WILL NOT be required to be in possession of a
 JMB Height Certificate or verification of measurement to compete in RIHS or HOYS
 Qualifiers. However qualifying animals will need to be measured WITHIN 28 DAYS OF
 QUALIFICATION OR BEFORE THE FINAL, WHICHEVER IS SOONER. The valid JMB full height
 certificate or a valid JMB annual height certificate must be submitted to the SHB(GB) office
 on receipt from the JMB and prior to competing at RIHS or HOYS. There are NO exceptions
 to this rule.

- Please pay particular notice to Amateur and Pretty Polly rules.
- For British Show Pony Society qualifiers including Pretty Polly any competitor who qualifies must register Pony, Owner & Rider within **7 days** to the BSPS.
- For Sport Horse Breeding (GB) and British Show Horse Association Any competitors who qualify will have 28 days from the show date to join the relevant society.

RIDDEN HUNTER CLASSES

British Show Horse Association

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Classes 7, 8, 9,10 and 11 are qualifiers for the Royal International Horse Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward. Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes. The highest placed unqualified exhibit in the top 5 in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Supreme of the Year Final. The Finals will be held at the BSHA National Championship Shows in September 2024. The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes). Recipients of the Young Rider rosette will qualify for the BSHA Young Rider of the Year at the National Championship Show in September 2024. The awards will go down the line; there is no limit on how many of these rosettes can be claimed in a year.

Classes will be judged under BSPA Rules. Download from www.bspaonline.com. Rider's age taken from 1st January. Spurs may not be worn in any pony class. Ponies 153cm or under (Shetlands exempt) must possess a current JMB height certificate before entry into the RIHS 2024. All stallions must be graded and licensed by BSPA or hold a BSPA Showing Permit (contact BSPA for Stallion showing permit information) for 2024 and have a BSPA stallion ID card and wear BSPA Stallion ID Disc. No rider under14 may exhibit a stallion in any class. Qualification: 1st place and the next unqualified competitor standing 2nd or 3rd qualify from each class. No competitor may qualify from lower than 3rd place.

Riders not to have attained their 9th birthday on 1st January of the current year. Riders in this class may not compete in any other class at all IPS Area Shows (Spring, Summer and Championship Shows)

CLASS 71 - NOVICE 143CMS WORKING HUNTER PONY. For ponies, mares or geldings, 4 years old and over, exceeding 133cms but not exceeding 143cms, suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 17th birthday on 1st January of current year.

CLASS 72 - NOVICE 133CMS WORKING HUNTER PONY. For ponies, mares or geldings, 4 years old and over, exceeding 123cms but not exceeding 133cms, suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 14th birthday on 1st January of current year.

CLASS 73 - OPEN WORKING STARTER STAKES. For ponies, mares or geldings, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 133cms, suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 12th birthday on 1st January of current year. The same combination of pony and rider may not compete in any class under 123cms at the same show on the same day.

CLASS 74 - OPEN 133CMS WORKING HUNTER PONY. For ponies, mares or geldings, 4 years old and over, exceeding 123cms but not exceeding 133cms, suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 14th birthday on 1st January of current year.

CLASS 75 - OPEN 143CMS WORKING HUNTER PONY. For ponies, mares or geldings, 4 years old and over, exceeding 133cms but not exceeding 143cms, suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 17th birthday on 1st January of current year.

CLASS 76 - OPEN 153CMS WORKING HUNTER PONY. For ponies, mares or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 143cms but not exceeding 153cms, suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 20th birthday on 1st January of current year

CLASS 77 - OPEN 158CMS WORKING HUNTER PONY. For ponies, mares or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 143cms but not exceeding 153cms, suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 25th birthday on 1st January of current year.

CHAMPIONSHIP 19 OPEN WHP CHAMPIONSHIP

1st & 2nd prize-winners in classes 74-76 to compete

CLASS 78 - RIHS WORKING HUNTER (Horses) WORKING HUNTER. A mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx) to be judged in accordance with the rules herein set out. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event horse as of 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes.

Fences to be a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 in number and a maximum height of 1.14m (3ft 9ins) at the discretion of the Judges.

Fences should have a natural appearance and not be easily dislodged.

No un-numbered obstacle can be included in the course.

The manner of going to be taken into account.

No change of rider or tack will be allowed (unless a horse is ridden under side-saddle, in which case, in order to allow the judge to ride, the saddle may be changed for the riding phase only).

A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed).

A skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the current approved BSI or European Standard must be worn by ALL competitors in the jumping phase of Working Hunter Classes. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover.

No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm up or in the actual class.

On completion of the jumping phase ALL CLEAR ROUNDS and any other horses the judges may require should be asked to return to the ring.

If a horse positively stops, ceases to go forwards at any time during its jumping round, or turns its quarters to a fence, or has a complete turnaround, these constitute refusals. If a horse jumps the incorrect fence out of a pen or lane it will be eliminated.

Horses displaying continued disobedience, or horses leaving the ring, whether mounted or dismounted will be eliminated.

Penalties:

First Refusal 15 Second Refusal 20 Third Refusal Elimination

Jumping Knockdown 10

(BS Rules apply for the definition of a knockdown) Fall of Horse or Rider Elimination Horses with minus scores may not be required for the second phase of the class at the discretion of

Under no circumstances should a horse with a minus score be in a qualifying position.

If Shows wish to save time, they can use two Judges, one of whom would judge the conformation and need not necessarily be on the Ridden Hunter Panel.

It is suggested that the Conformation Judge be asked to judge the conformation of the Working Hunter Class while the other Judge is judging the ride.

Horses must not be ridden by the Judge in the same ring and at the same time as other horses are jumping.

Suitable fences of natural appearance must be available.

Judges will not jump horses in Working Hunter Classes.

The maximum total points available is 100. This is made up of: Jumping points = Max 40 points, Style & Presence whilst Jumping = max 20 points, Ride/ Manners = max 20 points, Conformation = max 20 points. 40 points are awarded for Ride/Manners and Conformation. If there are two judges, Judge A awards a maximum score of 20 for Ride/Manners, Judge B awards a maximum score of 20 for conformation.

In the event of a tie in marks, the conformation mark will take precedence, followed by the ride mark, followed by the style mark. Judges should satisfy themselves that the course and fences are in keeping with the Society's recommendations, and Shows should allow time for this.

Working Hunter courses are not to be walked by competitors until the judge has given permission. There must be a change of course between Novice, Restricted Open and Open Working Hunter classes.

CLASS 79 - OPEN WORKING HUNTER LEAD REIN. In this Class, the Judge will be looking for a pony suitable to take its rider hunting on a lead rein. This is NOT a Handy Pony Competition but, in their individual show, ponies will be asked to negotiate small obstacles to a maximum height of 12" (30cms) such as bending poles, ground poles, zig zags, etc. A smooth and steady round suitable for the pace of the leader and ability of child is required. Cantering is not permitted. NO CROSS POLES allowed. For ponies, mares or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 123cms, suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 8th birthday on 1st January of current year. Riders in this Class may not compete in any other Class with the exception of any other Lead Rein, Beginner First Ridden and Beginner Cradle Stakes Classes.

CLASS 80 - BEGINNER CRADLE STAKES. For ponies, mares or geldings, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 123cms, suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 9th birthday on 1st January of current year. The rider may not compete in any other class at all IPS Area Shows (Spring, Summer and Championship Shows) with the exception of any other Lead Rein or Beginner First Ridden Class. There are no restrictions to how many years a rider can compete in Beginner classes but must adhere to age restrictions. However, the ability of the rider should be taken into account when judging this class. Riders may compete in an Open Cradle Stakes and points will be awarded. Riders in Beginners Classes may only compete in 50cms and 60cms Performance Jumping Classes. Fences in this class not to exceed 45cms.

CLASS 81 - OPEN CRADLE STAKES. For ponies, mares or geldings, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 123cms, suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 11th birthday on 1st January of the current year.

1st & 2nd prize winners in classes 79-81 to compete.

CLASS 82 - NOVICE WORKING STARTER STAKES. For ponies, mares or geldings, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 133cms that have not attained 50 points in Working Hunter Pony Classes, suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 12th birthday on 1st January of current year. The same combination of pony and rider may not compete in any class under 123cms at the same show on the same day.

CLASS 83 – OPEN CONNEMARA WORKING HUNTER 016: 4 years old and over, riders over 16 years on 1st January of current year.

CLASS 84 - OPEN CONNEMARA WORKING HUNTER U16: 4 years old and over, riders under 16 years on 1st January of current year.
