FOR BSPS CLASSES SEE RULE 43 IN THE BSPS HANDBOOK.

It is a condition of entry that Exhibitors agree to be bound by the rules herewith under. Any objection must be made in writing with a deposit of £100.00 in cash, (refundable if the objection is upheld), within 30 minutes of the class taking place.

The organising Committee accept no responsibility whatsoever for any loss, injury or damage to any person or their property whilst on the showground, car parks or approaches.

Horses/ponies which have been bred, sold, leased or produced by the Judge, his/her immediate family or employer are not eligible for that class.

Mountain and Moorland ponies must be:-

- a) Shown in their natural state.
- b) Registered with their respective Pure Breed Society.
- c) Registration number quoted on entry forms.

Stallions and colts must be adequately bitted and under the control of a competent rider/handler <u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: It is the rule of NPS & Ponies UK that Stallions/Colts may not be <u>led</u> by any juniors who have not attained their 14th birthday before January 1st in the current year. Riders must have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January of the current year when riding small breed Mountain & Moorland stallions and show/show hunter stallions not exceeding 128cms. Riders of large breed Mountain & Moorland stallions and show/show hunter stallion exceeding 128cms must have attained their 14th birthday before 1s January of the current year.

A Perpetual Trophy won by a competitor must be returned at the appropriate time to the Secretary either by hand or by registered post. Any lost trophies will have to be paid for at their replacement value.

Any person who is found to be abusive, violent, aggressive, towards any official connected to this Show will be asked to leave the showground IMMEDIATELY

Horses/ponies must be attended at all times when tied to the outside of a lorry or trailer.

ALL WHP Competitors

First, second and third prizewinners in appropriate classes will qualify and highest not qualified in the first six for Part Bred Welsh in appropriate classes. ALL champions and reserve champions at any NCPA Branch Show will receive a GOLDEN TICKET to qualify for the Golden Supreme Championships to be held at the Pony of the Year Show. Entry for the championships is FREE however competitors MUST be members of the NCPA and ENTER AT LEAST one other class at the championships. Prize money at the final is: 1st £500, 2nd £300, 3rd £100, 4th £50, 5th £25 and £25 for each supreme.

This show is a Qualifier for the NCPA Junior Mountain & Moorland Pony of the Year to be held at the 2024 N.C.P.A Pony of the Year Show. The highest placed pony and rider not already qualified in the first five will qualify. Qualification will go not lower than fifth place. Classes will be marked on a 50/50 mark system. The following classes are qualifiers:

NCPA Junior Mountain & Moorland Ridden Small Breeds: Registered Pure Bred Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A & B Mares or Geldings 4yr old or over. Riders not to have attained their 14th birthday before the 1st of January in the current year.

NCPA Junior Mountain & Moorland Ridden Large Breeds: Registered Pure Bred Connemara, Dales, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Welsh C & D Mares or Geldings 4yr old or over. Riders not to have attained their 18th birthday before the 1st of January in the current year.

This show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (B.S.P.S) and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in B.S.P.S classes, whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the Constitution and Rules of the B.S.P.S, including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.

This show is a qualifier for the BSPS Winter Championship to be held at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincs Competitors placed 1st - 3rd and 1st - 4th in relevant classes will qualify for the BSPS Winter Championships.

Competitors who are competing and have never been a member of the B.S.P.S will have 7 days to become members of the society and register their ponies which will enable them to compete at the winter championships at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincs.

This show is affiliated to the Side Saddle Association. These classes are run under SSA Rules defined in the current Member's Handbook, www.sidesaddleassociation.co.uk

This show is a affiliated to the Veteran Horse Society. Exhibits in the relevant classes, who comply with the V.H.S rules and conditions, will qualify for the Veteran Horse Championship Show to be held at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire. This Show is affiliated to The Rescue Equine Showing Society final taking place at the Equifest, Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 1st – 4th August 2024. The two highest exhibits not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify.

This Show is affiliated to the 2024 Equifest Showing Show, taking place at Arena UK, Granthm on the 1st - 4th August 2024.. Qualification cards will no longer be sent to the Show Secretary. Instead it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have a qualification card before entering the show and getting this signed by either the Judge, Steward or Show Secretary at the time of qualification. The champion and reserve champion in the Mountain and Moorland Supreme In Hand championship and the Riding Pony Breeding & Hunter Pony Breeding will qualify. Qualifiers do not have to be members of the NPS.

This show is affiliated to Equine Sports UK (ESUK) Grassroots Championships taking place at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 26th July - 28th July 2024 The three highest placed exhibits will qualify in each class" Please go to www.equinesportsuk.co.uk for clarification.

This show is affiliated to the British Show Horse Association (BSHA)

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Owners, Riders, In Hand Handlers & Horses must be registered or have temporary membership with a Day Ticket. Horses registered with the Association must be Owned, Exhibited and Ridden by current BSHA Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form

DAY TICKETS & SHOW TICKETS Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets and two Show Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Amateur, Home Produced, In-Hand, Novice, Working, Young Rider, and Open Affiliated classes only, but will NOT allow entry into RIHS, except Amateur classes or HOYS qualifying classes. A Show Ticket has the same criteria and covers all days of a Show running for longer than one day. Horses registered on a Day / Show Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day / Show Ticket by applying online on the BSHA website. Horses competing in the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain classes at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

RIHS AMATEUR QUALIFYING CLASSES Classes 8, 9, 10 & 11 are qualifiers for the Amateur Championships at The Royal International Horse Show. The highest placed unqualified horse in each section in each class in the Hack, Cob and Riding Horse classes will qualify for the RIHS Amateur final, with the two highest placed unqualified horses qualifying in the Maxi Cob. The BSHA offer a Champion rosette to be awarded in the separate Amateur Championship. Please refer to rule 6 & 7 in the 2024 BSHA Rulebook. The Amateur qualifying classes may be entered on a day ticket, but appropriate membership and horse registration must be applied for within 14 days of the qualifier in order to confirm qualification. This show is affiliated to the Sport Horse Breading of Great Britain

Rules as per the 2024 Handbook. Owners & riders have to be current SHB(GB) members in all ridden classes. RIHS qualifying classes – Classes 1 – 4, 5, 6, & 33 are qualifying classes for the RIHS 2024 and only horses registered on the 2021 register are eligible to enter. The two highest placed horses in the Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight & Small classes will qualify for the RIHS. No horse lower than second will qualify. In the Working Hunter class the three highest placed horses will qualify. No horse lower than third will qualify. Where there is only one amateur ridden hunter class the two highest placed smalls, the two highest placed lightweights, the two highest placed middleweights and the two highest placed heavyweights will qualify. When there are two classes, in the lightweight section, the two highest

placed smalls and the two highest placed lightweights will qualify and in the heavyweight section the two highest placed middleweights and the two highest placed heavyweights will qualify.

Open Working Hunter

Open to mares, geldings, stallions (must wear red, white & blue ribbon in tail) 4yrs old & over exceeding 148cms to be judged in accordance with SHB(GB) rules. Grade A show-jumpers & Advanced Event horses not eligible to compete in these classes.

Novice Working Hunter

Rules state not to have won a total of £200 or 5 BE Points or 200 BS Points.

Day Ticket -this entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 2 shows in the year at £36 per show – it covers owner and rider membership together with horse registration for these 2 shows. If the class is a qualifying class for RIHS, in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider membership and horse registration must be received in the SHB (GB) office within 14 days. Day ticket £36 per ticket.www.sporthorsegb.co.uk

AMATEUR STATUS:

A person is an amateur for showing purposes, when showing ridden hunters in an amateur class, *if he or she does not during the current or previous year:*

- 1) Engage in breeding, livery, buying, selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity or as a means of deriving a main source of income.
- 2) Accept remuneration whether it be monetary or goods in kind for employment in connection with horses in a racing, showing or livery stable or riding school (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted)
- 3) Show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm or a horse for which his or her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate concern.
 - In addition persons classed as Amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as a Brand Ambassador.
- 4) Own/part own an equestrian establishment including but not limited to riding schools, events centre, stud or livery yard in any capacity, or receive any form of remuneration for employment at an equestrian establishment. For the avoidance of doubt for the purpose of this rule, immediate family members of an owner or part owner of an equestrian establishment who work or are howsoever otherwise engaged or involved in any capacity, whether or not for remuneration at the equestrian establishment, will be treated as being an owner or part owner of that equestrian establishment.
- 5) Show a horse which a professional rider has ridden in any ridden hunter or ridden sport horse class during the current year, with the exception of working hunter classes & ladies hunter classes unless the horse has subsequently been re-registered under new ownership.
- 6) Professional show persons must not enter the Amateur Ring whilst the classes are in progress. A professional show person is another term for a professional producer and as such a professional groom who works for a producer can enter the ring to groom.
- 7) A professional rider must not ride or exercise an amateur's horse on the day it is competing in amateur classes
- 8) A competitor is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an Exhibit which has been qualified for either R.I.H.S or H.O.Y.S by a Professional during the current season, except in Ladies & Working Hunter Classes.
- 9) Amateur Home Produced Horses which are either stabled at home or in a D.I.Y yard and which since 1st January 2021 have not been shown by a professional during the current season or stabled in a professional yard at any time in 2021. Must be ridden by an Amateur. This does not exclude the Amateur owner home produced riders having lessons at any time with an instructor, providing the horse remains stabled at home or in a D.I.Y yard
