

AFFILIATION RULES & NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFICATIONS

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure they are conversant with the rules of the relevant governing Society.

ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW, HICKSTEAD 23rd – 28th July 2024

This Show is a qualifier for the Royal International Horse Show. The Small, Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight, Amateur, Ladies and Working Hunter, Small & Large Hack, Small & Large Riding Horse, Lightweight, Heavyweight and Maxi Cob, Amateur Hack, Cob & Riding horse and Working Show Horse classes are qualifiers. See below for qualification criteria in each section.

SPORTS HORSE BREEDING OF GREAT BRITAIN

This Show is affiliated to SPORT HORSE BREEDING OF GREAT BRITAIN and all Hunter Classes will be judged under the Society's 2024 Rules.

<u>SHB(GB) – Hat Rule</u> SHB(GB) strongly recommends that competitors aged 18 and over wear correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards: All PAS 015; VG1; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. It is mandatory for competitors under the age of 18 to wear such skull caps or hats. In the jumping phase of Working Hunter classes the aforementioned skull caps/hats must be worn.

The Small Hunter, Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight, Ladies, Working Hunter and Amateur Hunter classes (14 - 19 & 102) are qualifying events for this year's **Royal International Horse Show** (23rd to 28th July 2024), and only horses registered on the current year Show Hunter Register are eligible to enter.

- Day Ticket = £42 (this entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 2 shows at £42 per show in the year it covers owner and rider membership together with horse registration for that show). If the class is a qualifying class for RIHS, in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider membership and horse registration must be received in the SHB(GB) office within 14 days.
- The two highest placed horses in the Small Hunter, Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight and Ladies classes will qualify to enter at the RIHS. No horse lower than second will qualify. The three highest placed horses in the Working Hunter classes will qualify. The 2 highest placed Small, Lightweight, Middleweight & Heavyweights will qualify in the Amateur Hunter class (Please refer to the 2024 Rule Book for Amateur

PLEASE NOTE SMALL HUNTER MEASUREMENT RULES FOR 2024

SMALL HUNTER. Any mare or gelding, 4 years old or over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx) but not exceeding 158cm (15.2hh approx). A horse, which is registered as a Small Hunter, cannot compete in an Open Weight Class. Animals in ridden height restricted classes WILL NOT be required to be in possession of a JMB Height Certificate or verification of measurement to compete in RIHS or HOYS Qualifiers. However qualifying animals will need to be measured WITHIN 28 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION OR BEFORE THE FINAL, WHICHEVER IS SOONER. The valid JMB full height certificate or a valid JMB annual height certificate must be submitted to the SHB(GB) office on receipt from the JMB and prior to competing at RIHS or HOYS. There are NO exceptions to this rule.

Registration numbers must be quoted on entry forms and for ALL SHB(GB) classes, owners, producers and riders must be members of the Society.

BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION

(formerly British Show Hack, Cob & Riding Horse Association)

This Show is affiliated to the BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION and the Hack, Riding Horse and Cob classes will be held under the Rules and jurisdiction of the British Show Horse Association.

- Horses must be registered with the Association and all Owners, Exhibitors and Riders must be Association Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form. (*The Amateur Hack, Riding Horse, Cob, Maxi Cob and Working Show Horse can show on a "Day Ticket"*)
- Classes 1 to 7 are qualifiers for Open finals at The Royal International Horse Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward.
- Classes 8 -11 are qualifiers for the Amateur Championships at The Royal International Horse Show. The highest placed unqualified horse in each section in each class in the Hack, Cob and Riding Horse classes will qualify for the RIHS Amateur final, with the two highest placed unqualified horses qualifying in the Maxi Cob class. The BSHA offer a Champion rosette to be awarded in the separate Amateur Championship. Please refer to rules 6 & 7 in the 2024 BSHA Rulebook
- Class 100 qualifies for the Open Working Show Horse Championship at The Royal International Horse Show. The winner, if not already qualified in the Working Show Horse class will qualify. If the first has already qualified, the qualification may pass down to no lower than fifth place.
- Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cob and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB(GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.
- The highest placed unqualified prize winners in all **Open** Affiliated classes will qualify to compete in the BSHA Supreme of the Year Classes at the National Championship Show on 12th 14th September 2024.
- The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section.
- Class 100 also qualifies for the BSHA SEIB Open Working Show Horse Final at the BSHA National Championship Show on 12th - 14th September 2024. The two highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify.
- TURLEY & GILL AMATEUR HOME PRODUCED QUALIFIER (class 12) Owners, Riders and Horses must be registered with BSHA or have temporary membership with a Day Ticket. Riders must be 15years of age or older. This class is a qualifier for the Turley & Gill Family Amateur Home-Produced Supreme Final to be held at the BSHA National Championship Show. Open to horses to be Home-Produced and ridden by an Amateur; please see rule 6 in 2024 BSHA Rulebook. Horses must be registered as a either a Hack, Cob, Maxi Cob or Riding Horse. The two highest placed unqualified in the top five will qualify for the final at the BSHA National Championship Show.
- BSHA OPEN RACEHORSE TO SHOW HORSE CLASS Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. Open to thoroughbred horses retired from training. The class will run as an open ridden class, therefore all exhibits will be ridden by the judge and all exhibits maybe required to gallop. The two highest unqualified exhibits qualify for the final at the BSHA National Championship Show. Horses must be registered with the Association as either a Hack, Riding Horse or Hunter to compete at the final in September 2024 (day ticket available).

Can we please remind competitors in all the BSPS classes must adhere to rule 43 in the BSPS Rule Book regarding hat specification and tagging and in BSPS WHP and Heritage WHP classes it is now compulsory for all riders to wear a body protector to Level 3 2018 (with blue or black labels) while jumping, including in the warm up ring. Hats must also be up to date <u>Please see Rules 43 & 50 on pages 12 & 14 of the BSPS Rule Book</u>

This Show is affiliated to the **British Show Pony Society (BSPS)** (affiliation number: 692) to hold qualifiers for the London International Horse Show at ExCel, London on $18^{th} - 22^{nd}$ December 2024 and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS Classes whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the Rules of the BSPS including the disciplinary procedures and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS. This show is a qualifier for the London International Horse Show Qualifying Classes.

Only one pony in each of classes 106 & 107 will qualify and the highest placed (not already qualified) from the first THREE ponies placed in each class will qualify. Non-members of the BSPS have seven days to complete their registration and membership to keep the qualification. If not, this will pass to the next exhibitor.

BRITISH SHOW PONY SOCIETY CLASSES

- This Show is a qualifier for the 2024 BSPS Championships Show to be held at Arena UK.
- 1st and 2nd prizewinners only in the Open Lead Rein, Open First Ridden, Open Nursery Stakes, and the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizewinners in the Open Cradle Stakes, Open Intermediate Classes, Heritage Mountain & Moorland Open Ridden and WHP classes and the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th prizewinners in Mixed Height Open Show Pony, Mixed Height Open Show Hunter Pony, Mixed Height Open WHP will qualify for the BSPS Championships provided the animal is registered in accordance with Rules 21 and 26 and ridden by a BSPS member.

RULE 21. Ponies must be registered BEFORE the date of the Show at which they qualify, except in the case of exhibitors who have never been members before who are allowed 7 days in which to become members and register their ponies..

- <u>BSPS CHALLENGE</u> This Show is a qualifier for the BSPS Challenge. Animals competing in the following Open Classes will qualify: Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Show Pony, SHP, WHP, Intermediate, and Heritage Ridden & WHP classes. Ponies must not have qualified for the 2024 Horse of the Year Show. If a pony qualifies for the Horse of the Year Show it will forfeit its qualification for the B.S.P.S. Challenge
- <u>BSPS "BINKS FAMILY" CHAMPIONS OF CHAMPIONS</u> This Show is a qualifier for the BSPS Champion of Champions, the 1st placed Prize Winners in the open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Open Show Pony, Open SHP, Open WHP, Open Intermediate SRT, SHT & WH, and Open Heritage Ridden & Open WHP will qualify.
- <u>BSPS "BINKS FAMILY" MINI WHP CHAMPIONS OF CHAMPIONS</u> This Show is a qualifier for the BSPS The Binks Family Mini WHP Champion of Champions, the 1st Prize Winners in the Open Cradle and Nursery Stakes will qualify.

CHAPS(UK) CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW

This Show is affiliated to the Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK) (Affiliation No: 24-146). Both the owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse/pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However, in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be current Showing Member and have a valid Qualifier Card. **The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 15th to 17th August 2024 at Arena UK.** The following classes are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers (Classes 38-43). The Highest placed Coloured Horse/Pony also qualify from the Lead Rein, First Ridden and Veteran classes. For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only "coloured" horses and ponies (as defined in the current CHAPS UK Members' Handbook) may compete in these classes. **All Stallions 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must display Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.**

- (the 2 Highest placed ponies not already qualified from Classes 36 & 37 will qualify Qualification to go no lower than 4th place)

- (the 2 Highest placed ponies not already qualified from Classes 116 to 119 will qualify *Qualification to go no lower than 4th place*)
- NPS Scotland/Townhead Pet n Pony Inhand M&M Championship
- (Champion & Reserve from classes 72 to 77 to qualify and can go down to 1st Reserve)

- (the Highest placed pony not already qualified from Classes 68 to 71 will qualify *Qualification to go no lower than 4th place*)
- NPS Scotland/Maggie May Junior Ridden M&M Championship

The rules for these competitions are as follows:

- 1) All Mountain & Moorland Ponies must be registered in the <u>main body</u> of their respective stud book. Part bred, X registered ponies, ponies in the appendices of their main stud book and Eriskay ponies are not eligible.
- 2) In Mountain and Moorland classes riders of stallions must be 12 years old or over when riding small breeds (Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh A & B). For large breeds (Highland, Fell, Dales, Connemara, New Forest, Welsh C & D) riders of stallions must be 14 years old or over.
- 3) A child must have attained their 12th birthday as of the 1st January in the current year to either strip or lunge pony at a NPS show, except for stallions where age will same as in the Rule Book to ride a stallion.
- 4) Handlers of stallions or colts must be 14 years old or over.
- 5) Please note NO Stallions can compete or qualify for the Junior Ridden classes
- 6) Handlers of ponies in In Hand classes must be at least 5 years of age and those who are aged 14 years and under must wear a correctly secured skull caps/riding hat that meets the current standards.
- 7) All ridden ponies must be shown off the lead rein except in the specified Lead Rein Qualifier Class.
- 8) Cavasson nosebands are the only nosebands permitted in flat ridden classes.

9) NPS Scotland Kilmannan Novice Ridden

Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit an entry for the final in the first year.

- 12) Shows, especially those held early in the year, may reduce the heights and spreads shown above in order to encourage riders to compete, but competitors that qualify must be aware that the jumps will be as above for the Finals at Blair
- 13) The course will consist of a minimum of seven fences, one of which must be a spread, a change of direction must be included. If a hazard is included, it will be numbered and judged as a fence. A water tray jump will be included at the final.
- 14) It is not mandatory for ponies to be stripped at qualifier shows but all ponies will be stripped at the finals (Novice Ridden, Junior Ridden, Open Ridden and Working Hunter Pony)
- 15) Qualification in the M&M In Hand Section may go to 3rd in the Championship.
- 16) Qualification for M&M Novice, Junior, Open, WHP, Lead Rein, First Ridden and Riding pony/Hunter pony classes may go to no lower than 4th place
- 17) Ponies may only qualify once for each NPS Scotland Competition Final.
- 18) Ponies that take a second qualifier for the same section will be disqualified from entering the final.
- 19) It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that their jockey/handler is aware of their pony's qualification status
- 20) <u>A Judge is not obliged to award an NPS Scotland Finals qualification if he/she feels that the pony is</u> <u>not of a sufficient standard</u>
- 21) Entries will only be accepted via our on-line entry system, Entrymaster
- 22) It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to keep the qualification card safely as it is essential to complete your entry. Paper entries will not be accepted
- 23) <u>Closing Dates for Entries:</u> All entries will close on 7th August 2024. No Late entries will be accepted. Please refer to NPS Scotland website for directions on" How to submit your entry" using the Entrymaster system
- 24) The <u>OWNER</u> of the pony must be or become a member of NPS Scotland before entering the Finals.

25) The Final will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 23rd August 2024

Stallions -All stallions (pure or part bred, four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class MUST be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, MUST be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook. Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature. CLASS 101 **'RIHS QUALIFIER' WORKING HUNTER** A mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms (14.2hh approx) to be judged in accordance with the rules herein set out. Grade A Show Jumpers or Advanced Event horses are not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes. <u>The maximum total points available is 100. This</u> is made up of: Jumping points = Max 40 points, Style & Presence whilst Jumping = Max 20 points, Ride = Max 20 points, Conformation = Max 20 points. Fences to be a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 in number and a max height 1.14m (3' 9") at the discretion of the Judge. Fences should have a natural appearance and not be easily dislodged. No un-numbered obstacle can be included in the course. The manner of going to be taken into account. No change of rider or tack will be allowed (unless a horse is ridden under side saddle, in which case, in order to allow the Judge to ride, the saddle may be changed for the riding phase only). *A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed)*. A skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the current approved BSI or European Standard must be worn by ALL competitors in the jumping phase of the Class. NO HIND BOOTS OR BANDAGES OF ANY DESCRIPTION ARE ALLOWED IN THE COLLECTING RING, WARM UP OR IN THE ACTUAL CLASS. On completion of the jumping phase <u>all</u> <u>clear rounds</u> and any other horses the judge may require should be asked to return to the ring. If a horse positively stops, ceases to go forwards at anytime during its jumping round, or turns its quarters to a fence out of a pen or lane it will be eliminated. Horse displaying continued disobedience, or horses leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted will be eliminated.


