



Points & Special Awards

Members are awarded points in all classes as follows: 1st = 10 points, 2nd = 8 points, 3rd = 7 points, 4th = 6 points.

3 attendance points are awarded to members who present in the ring and are not placed.

In order to be eligible for points, members need to enter the same class on 4 separate occasions, over the course of a show season.

To accumulate points competitors need to enter the same horse / pony and rider combination. For Inhand classes the handler must be the same consistent member. For all classes in Ring 3 the horse / pony must be consistent to accumulate points.

POINTS AWARDED IN RING 3, HANDY PONY and NOVELTY CLASSES ARE NOT TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT FOR SPECIAL AWARDS.

Point winners 1st - 4th in each class will receive special prizes at our presentation evening. 1ST PRIZE WINNERS ALSO RECEIVE A RETURNABLE TROPHY. You must attend the presentation evening to collect your prize or it will be forfeited.

Anyone becoming a member on the day can have points for the whole day. Anyone joining between shows can not back date points.

VICTOR LUDORUM—this is awarded to the same horse / pony & rider / handler who wins the most first prizes over the whole show season.

SENIOR RIDDEN & JUNIOR RIDDEN POINTS CHAMPION—These two awards are presented to the Senior member and Junior member who accumulates the most points in ridden classes over the course of the season.

Points & Special Awards

WORKING HUNTER CHAMPION—this is awarded to the rider and horse / pony combination who accumulates the most points over the working hunter classes over the course of the season. **INHAND CHAMPION**—this is awarded to the horse / pony who ac-

INHAND CHAMPION—this is awarded to the horse / pony who accumulates the most points over the inhand classes over the course of the season.

DRESSAGE CHAMPION—this is awarded to the horse / pony who accumulates the most points over the dressage classes over the course of the season.

CAROLINE BOOTH MEMORIAL—this prize is awarded to the highest placed pure bred welsh pony or cob who accumulates the most points in Inhand and Ridden M&M classes over the course of the season.







When judging classes using the Marks System horses should be stripped for the Conformation Judge. Where there is an equality of marks, the ride marks take precedence, however if there still remains a tie then the Ride Judge's decision is final. If an exhibitor declines the Judge's ride the horse will not be placed.



- ⇒ Trophies awarded at the Presentation Dance last year MUST be returned to a committee member by the end of September at the latest. A penalty of £5 plus the cost of extra telephone calls and postage will be levied on ALL late returns.
- ⇒ In all classes subject to age limits, age is counted as at 1st January of the current year.
- ⇒ Riders must wear correctly fitted headgear to the current standard whilst mounted any where on the showground. Junior members are also compelled to wear them when competing in Inhand or Novelty classes.
- ⇒ Stallions and Colts may not be ridden or led by juniors who have not attained their 14th birthday in the current year. Any animal not kept sufficiently under control will be asked to leave the showground immediately by any Judge, Steward or Official of the Club. Stallion owners are reminded that it is forbidden to run out their exhibit along the horse-box lines.
- ⇒ Cantering on the showground is not permitted, except in Rings and official working- in areas.
- ⇒ It is not permitted to leave an animal tied up outside a trailer or horsebox unattended.
- ⇒ The Judge's decision is final and binding in all cases. Any queries are to be addressed to an Official of the Club.
- ⇒ Objections are to be submitted in writing to the Chairman or Show Secretary within 20 minutes of the end of a class and accompanied by £50, which will be returned if the complaint is upheld.

- ⇒ Spurs or whips are not allowed in Handy Pony / Horse or any WH Class., by any age of rider.
- ⇒ Whips are not to exceed 30 inches in length except in Dressage.
- ⇒ Spurs are not permitted to junior riders in any class.
- ⇒ Novice classes may not be entered by exhibits (horse or pony) who have won an open or novice class in that discipline prior to January of the current season at any show.
- ⇒ Competitors in Qualifying classes must abide by the rules of those associations as well as those of the club.
- ⇒ Members must have started the 'go round' in showing classes and the 'jumping phase' in Working Hunter classes to obtain attendance points.
- ⇒ Ribble Valley Riding Club has no towing facilities on the ground therefore competitors are reminded that in wet weather conditions vehicles will NOT be permitted to cross the river.
- ⇒ Competitors are reminded that it is unethical to show under a judge with a vested interest in their animal.
- ⇒ It is forbidden to ride any horse / pony which is under 4 years old and Competitors MUST be 4 years old and over to ride a pony on the Showground (Lead Rein is age 3 as per BSPS rules at BSPS Show only).
- ⇒ Points Rosettes, Trophies & Sashes must be collected at the Presentation night or will be forfeited.
- \Rightarrow Earrings and Body Studs must not be worn.
- $\Rightarrow\,$ No back boots allowed in the Working Hunter ring.
- ⇒ Body protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes including practice ring.
- ⇒ Full show attire isn't necessary in the beginners ring but correct standard Hat, Boots and Jodhpurs must be worn; jackets not necessary but rider's arms must be covered.




