Hats (Reg 7(i)	All mounted persons on the showground to wear safety hats which conform to the current regulations.
Arrival (Reg 13)	
Wednesday	12:00noon to 10:00pm
Thursday & Friday	5:00am to 10:00pm

Stables (Reg 14)	Booking is for a 24hr period, from 5:00pm to 5:00pm the following day. Accommodation cannot be guaranteed until 5:00pm.
Correctness of Details (Reg 18)	It is the Exhibitors' or Competitors' responsibility to ensure that all the information provided is correct.
Refunds (Reg 20)	Refunds will only be provided on production of a veterinary certificate. which must be received by the Entries Office no more than 7 days after the last day of Show. Levies included in the entry fee will not be refunded. Stable fees will not be refunded.
Eligibility to Enter (Reg 21)	Exhibitors must ensure the entry is registered with the appropriate breed society for the classes being entered and, where necessary, the Owner, Rider and Exhibitor.
Payment of Prizes (Regs 35 & 36)	Winning exhibitors will be issued with a prize money voucher which must be redeemed during the show. Vouchers not presented will be forfeited.
Objections (Reg 40)	Must be made in writing and submitted to the Society Office no later than 17:00 on the day of the class and accompanied by a deposit of £50.
GDPR Condition of Entry	Details of entries made will only be shared with breed societies and/or shows to confirm eligibility and/or qualification. Results will be displayed on the Show's web site. Breed societies will also provide/use some of your information. Please go to the relevant society's web page to view their policy as to how, when and why your details will be used.
Equine Flu (Reg 49)	All equines attending the Royal Bath & West Show 2024 must have been vaccinated for Equine Influenza. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 – 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an EI vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old.

National Gelding In-hand Championships sponsored by Sarum Stud

All first and second placed WPCS registered Welsh Part Bred exhibits in relevant classes (not already qualified) qualify to enter. Unregistered qualifiers with 12.5% Welsh blood may retrospectively register with WPCS prior to entry. In the Part Bred Welsh classes the Champion and Reserve will qualify.

National Ridden Welsh Part Bred Championships

All first and second placed WPCS registered Welsh Part Bred exhibits in relevant classes (not already qualified) qualify to enter. Unregistered qualifiers with 12.5% Welsh blood may retrospectively register with WPCS prior to entry.

National Ridden Welsh Breeds Championships sponsored by Brynseion Stud

All first and second placed WPCS registered Welsh exhibits in relevant classes (not already qualified) qualify to enter.

The IDHS (GB) £2000 Challenge

H103-110, H112, H124, H125, H1-H4 & H7-H9

This show is a qualifier for the IDHS(GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge. The highest placed horse/s (not already qualified) from each of the above classes will qualify for the final of the IDHS (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 7th & 8th September 2024 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ.

A horse may only qualify for the final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered.

Qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS Show Team. Qualifiers are required to complete an online form at <u>www.idhsgb.org.uk</u> to inform the IDHS (GB) that they have qualified for the final. In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money, and a trophy the Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Purebred Irish Draught will receive a trophy and £100, and the highest placed Sport Horse will receive a trophy and £50.

Moorbennhall ID Youngstock Challenge The IDHS (GB) Sport Horse Youngstock Challenge

Class H123

The two highest placed Irish Draught pure-breds and Irish Draught Sport Horses from each age group in Class H123 yearlings, two year olds and three year olds, that are eligible for Class 1 on the Irish Draught Breed Register by an RID (GB), Class 1 or Class 2 sire out of a Graded dam, OR registered on the Irish Draught Sport Horse Register (must have a minimum of 25% proven ID breeding). If one or both have already qualified, the horse next in line in each age group will qualify for their respective final which will be held at the 7th & 8th September 2024 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ.

Qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS Show Team. Qualifiers are required to complete an online form at <u>www.idhsgb.org.uk</u> to inform the IDHS (GB) that they have qualified for the final. In their respective final, there will be three preliminary classes with the two highest placed semi[1]finalists from each class going forward to the Championship where the Champion will receive £500 and the Reserve Champion £150.

The objective of the competition is to find the supreme light horse or pony in-hand champion of the year, irrespective of breed or type (excluding heavy horses). The Champion horse or pony from the following classes will be eligible to compete, provided it has not already won a qualifying round in 2024.

Hunter Breeding, Hack Breeding, Riding Horse Breeding, Sport Horse Breeding, Irish Draught Breeding, Riding Pony Breeding, Coloured Horse and Pony Breeding, Anglo-Arab or Part Bred Arab, Connemara, Dales & Fell, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Highland, New Forest, Shetland (Miniature), Shetland (Standard), Welsh Mountain Pony (Section A), Welsh Pony (Section B), Welsh Pony (Cob Type) (Section C), Welsh Cob (Section D), Miniature horse and Part Bred Welsh.

If the Champion has already qualified or is ineligible, then the Reserve Champion of that section may come forward, provided it has not already qualified and is eligible. If both Champion and Reserve Champion have already qualified or are ineligible then the section will not be represented in this qualifying round. Foal champions are not eligible.

In the event of a horse/pony having been awarded more than one section Championship at this Show, that horse/pony will represent both/all sections and the qualification will not pass down to the Reserve in the 2nd and subsequent sections.

There will be no direct entry in The Price Family Supreme In-hand Championship Qualified, all animals must be a section champion or reserve champion (as applicable).

NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR STUDS M&M IN HAND SILVER MEDAL ROSETTE

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M In Hand sections.

To be judged under the rules of the NPS. NPS silver medal rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the Owner of the Champion Pony is not a Member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion Pony, provided the Owner of that pony is a Member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Rosette Championships.

HC2 NPS/Blackertor & Sharptor Studs M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 6-8 August 2024. NPS M&M Breed Champions Prelim Rounds Qualifier for the Great British In Hand Show – 7th September 2024, Oakridge Arena.

RIDDEN COBS & WORKING SHOW HORSE

Judges: Mr Jack Cochrane - Conformation & Mr Nicholas Collins – Ride (Ridden Cobs) Mr Jack Cochrane - Conformation & Miss Bridget Millington - Ride (Working Show Horse)

Judging on: Thursday

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Owners, Riders and Horses must be registered or have temporary membership with a Day Ticket. Horses registered with the Association must be Owned, Exhibited and Ridden by current BSHA Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry.

DAY TICKETS: Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Amateur, Home Produced, In-Hand, Novice, Working, Young Rider and Open affiliated classes only, BUT WILL NOT ALLOW entry into RIHS (excluding Working Show Horse) or HOYS qualifying classes. Horses registered on a Day Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day Ticket by downloading an application form, or apply online on the BSHA website.

Horse of the Year Show

Classes H2, H3 & H4 are qualifiers for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 9th-13th October 2024, and will attract a £18.00 Horse of the Year Show contribution with each entry. Qualification will not pass below fifth place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office. Owners, Riders, producers and horses must be registered with BSHA.

The qualifying horse will be the highest placed, previously unqualified, exhibit within the top 5 placings.

Classes will be run in accordance with the general rules set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from <u>www.hoys.co.uk</u>.

This is a Horse of the Year Show Qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Limited and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. For full policy details please visit <u>www.grandstandentries.com</u>.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

BSHA SUPREME OF THE YEAR

The highest placed unqualified exhibit in the top 5 in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Supreme of the Year Final. The Finals will be held at the BSHA National Championship Shows in September 2024.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes). Recipients of the Young Rider rosette will qualify for the BSHA Young Rider of the Year at the National Championship Show in September 2024.

National Welsh Championship Show

This Show is a qualifier for The National Ridden Welsh PB Championships. All first and second placed WPCS registered Welsh PB exhibits in the classes (not already qualified) qualify to enter. See Qualifier page for full details.

The IDHS(GB) £2000 Challenge

This Show is a qualifier and the highest placed horse (not already qualified) in H1, H2, H3 & H4 will qualify for the Final of the IDHS(GB) £2000 Challenge. See Qualifier page for details.

Class H1 NOVICE COB/MAXI COB, MARE OR GELDING

Four years old or over, exceeding 148cms. A Novice is a Hack, Cob, Maxi Cob or Riding Horse that has not won a first prize of £25 or more, or more than a total of £150 (including any Championship Prize Money) in any showing classes excluding Working Show Horses, Best Trained, Pairs, Side Saddle, or In-Hand classes that were Affiliated to the Association, at home or abroad, prior to 1st January in the current year. Winnings as a 4 year old are exempt, unless that 4 year old has won an Open Ridden class with a first prize of £25 or more. If the category has changed from a Hack to a Riding Horse or vice versa, it may not revert back to a Novice. Snaffle bridles may be worn for Novice classes. Novice animals must be Registered with the Association or Exhibitors must have purchased a 'Day Ticket' in order to compete in Novice classes. Animals which have been placed in the top five at either the Royal International Horse Show or Horse of the Year Show in any OPEN ridden class, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of the Search for a Star finals, are ineligible to compete in Novice Hack, Cob, Maxi Cob or Riding Horse classes. Horses competing in Novice classes must be ridden by the Judge, before being asked to "strip" for conformation.

Class H6 RIHS & SEIB OPEN WORKING SHOW HORSE QUALIFYING CLASS, MARE OR GELDING

This class is a qualifier for the Open Working Show Horse Championship at The Royal International Horse Show. All affiliated BSHA Open Working Show Horse classes are qualifiers for the Royal International Horse Show final and the SEIB Working Show Horse Final. For the RIHS qualification, the winner, if not already qualified in the Working Show Horse class will qualify. If the first has already qualified, the qualification may pass down to no lower than fifth place. For the SEIB Working Show Horse qualification, the two highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify.

Open **ONLY** to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses, mare or gelding four years old and over, exceeding 148cms. This class is **NOT** open to Hunters, ie those horses registered

and competing as a hunter or working hunter with BSHA, Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain or The Showing Register for the current season.

Please refer to rule 2(iv) in the 2024 BSHA Rulebook. The Working Show Horse qualifying classes may be entered on a day ticket, but appropriate membership and horse registration must be applied for within 14 days of the qualifier in order to confirm qualification. Any Horse which is a Grade B Showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above, as at the 1st January of the current year, is not eligible to compete in any Working Show Horse class. A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase but must then select one Horse to take through to the Ride and Conformation phases (if required). No change of Rider is allowed (RIHS)

A Day Ticket will allow entry into Novice, Amateur, Young Rider, Home Produced, Working, In-Hand and Open affiliated classes only BUT WILL NOT ALLOW entry into RIHS qualifying Open classes. Horses registered on a Day Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day Ticket by downloading an application form or apply online on the BSHA website.

Royal International Horse Show

Classes H8 & H9 are qualifiers for The Royal International Horse Show and will attract a £11.00 RIHS levy with each entry. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward.

Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

BSHA National Championship Show

The highest placed unqualified exhibit in the top 5 in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Supreme of the Year Final. The Finals will be held at the BSHA National Championship Shows in September 2024.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes). Recipients of the Young Rider rosette will qualify for the BSHA Young Rider of the Year at the National Championship Show in September 2024.

The IDHS(GB) £2000 Challenge

Novice animals must be Registered with the Association or Exhibitors must have purchased a 'Day Ticket' in order to compete in Novice classes. Animals which have been placed in the top five at either the Royal International Horse Show or Horse of the Year Show in any OPEN ridden class, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of the Search for a Star finals, are ineligible to compete in Novice Hack, Cob, Maxi Cob or Riding Horse classes. Horses competing in Novice classes must be ridden by the Judge, before being asked to "strip" for conformation.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

This competition is open to mares, geldings and CHAPS(UK) graded stallions, four years old and over, to be registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of the main body of the stud books of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society (CHAPS(UK)) or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association (TGCA). Stallions are required to wear stallion discs in order to compete.

All Exhibits, Riders and Owners must be Members of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society, The Showing Register or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association.

All Stallions must be graded with CHAPS (UK). Stallion ID Discs to be worn in the ring. Lead reins not eligible for these classes. These classes will be run in accordance with the general rules set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk.

These classes are Horse of the Year Show Qualifiers, all data given upon entry is provided to Grandstand Media Limited and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. For full policy details please visit <u>www.grandstandentries.com</u>.

Only one exhibit may qualify per class. If the first placed animal has already qualified, the qualifier may pass down to the highest placed exhibit standing to fifth place only, who has not already qualified. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office. No spurs to be worn by junior competitors (under 18 years), or any rider competing in a restricted height section. All ages taken as at 1 January in the current year.

Horses/ponies are to be produced at Horse of the Year Show in the same type category in which they qualified.

Failure to comply with ANY of the Qualifying Rules will result in the forfeit of the qualifying place.
